






**BATHS OF CARACALLA**

Huge size

Gardens/park all round

Remains of central dome of caldarium

Palaestra


REMEMBER

The central block is bigger than the British Museum

Pool of the frigidarium is as big as an Olympic swimming pool Underneath were miles of vaulted stores, furnaces, corridors etc.

**IMAGINE** 

Sculptures adorning rooms including the Farnese Hercules & the Farnese bull (now in Archaeological Museum in Naples)



As you return from the Baths of Caracalla to the Colosseum

NOTICE

The remains of an extension to the Aqua Claudia which supplied the huge quantities of water required by the palaces of the Palatine hill

# ARCH OF CONSTANTINE

Dedicated in 315AD - celebrated the battle of the Milvian Bridge. Incorporating various sculptural pieces from earlier monuments

LOOKAT

Dacian prisoners (at the top) from a building of Trajan's time Panels from the time of Marcus Aurelius between the prisoners Round panels from Hadrian's reign

# THE VATICAN CITY

#### ST PETER'S

The church was said to have been built over the tomb of St Peter about 90AD close to the Circus of Nero - there is an early cemetery below it.

Constantine began the first basilica here.

Bernini's piazza with its four rows of columns
The obelisk brought to Rome from Alexandria for Circus of Nero
The dome built by Michelangelo in the 16<sup>th</sup> century
The façade added in the 17<sup>th</sup> century

#### 8 \* HOUSE OF SMALL FOUNTAIN (Reg VI, Ins 8, 23)

LOOK FOR

Fountain decorated with shells & mosaic

Wall paintings - sea scenes

#### HOUSE OF ASELLINUS (Reg VI, Ins 8)

NOTICE

Painting of Adonis & Venus in peristyle

## 9 HOUSE OF CASTOR & POLLUX (Reg VI, Ins 9, 6) (probably shut)

NOTICE

Corinthian atrium (i.e. with columns supporting roof)

Kitchen in far left corner

4<sup>th</sup> style paintings Lararium in peristyle 1

Fishpond in peristyle 2

## HOUSE OF MELEAGER (Reg VI, Ins 9,2) (probably shut)

LOOK FOR

Atrium with marble table

Tablinum behind


Peristyle to side with fountain

#### 10 TOWER OF MERCURY

Part of fortified walls of city Originally a gate, remodelled into tower with two floors above ground level

## 11 \* HOUSE OF THE FAUN (Reg VI, Ins 12,2)

This is a good house to study in detail - its plan is quite easy to follow One of the early houses, it fills the whole block It belonged to Saturninus Cassius
